In Fiscal Year 2013, SNAP provided about \$0.5 billion dollars in food benefits to a monthly average of 316,983 people in Kansas. The program served 72 percent of those eligible for benefits in Kansas in 2012. SNAP also has an economic multiplier effect; every dollar in new SNAP benefits results in \$1.80 in total economic activity.
